Today is 'Trinity Sunday' when we celebrate God the Father – God the Son - and God the Holy Spirit, in whom we worship.

Everyone has their own different images of this and sometimes it is difficult to comprehend, especially in our human terms. There are images and paintings depicting the artists views of The Trinity, The Three in One, and many words spoken on this subject, and many hymns sung, all trying to explain this relationship. But this relationship doesn't have to be explained in technical or intellectual terms, tying us in knots, causing confusion! It is to be worshipped in awe and wonder. Throughout the whole of the Bible we see the workings of all three.





Here in John's gospel, and in the previous chapters, Jesus is teaching the disciples of what is to come, explaining who he is and what will happen, and indeed what it will mean for them, and the world from now on. In chapter 14 Jesus was explaining his relationship with the Father, "If you know me, me you will know my Father also" and now, in chapter 16, Jesus is speaking of another part of him, the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of truth. The disciples are being gathered in and welcomed into this world, they are being given an insight of what to expect, and how they will be guided.

Paul, in his letter to the Romans, re-enforces that it is through Jesus Christ that we have access to his grace and love which has been poured out through the Holy Spirit, and the wonderful thing is, that it's available for us all today. As we stand in the peace of God, we can truly sing Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God almighty.
