## To think about

# Message from a Circuit Friend

Like many preachers I have found Trinity Sunday a real challenge compared to other Sunday services. God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. 'God in 3 persons, blessed Trinity' as the hymn goes. Substituting 'as' instead of 'the' helps me understand a bit (in other words, thinking of 'as Trinity' rather than 'the Trinity'- ed), that God can be all three. However, I have to accept that the mystery of God as three persons is not solved by one simple answer. Instead, I am happy to accept that God is Majestic and Mighty but loves even me; that Jesus came into the world and saved me from my sins by dying on a cross and that Jesus promised the Holy Spirit to enable his disciples to go out and spread the good news. That is what we were celebrating last Sunday at Pentecost.

But the readings today show others who asked questions. Isaiah who had a vision, considered himself unworthy and said so to God but was absolved of his sins and used to serve God. This reading fascinates me as it was the first one I ever read in a church service and it has stuck in my memory, but also because Isaiah sought God and considered himself unworthy. Nicodemus also asked questions of Jesus. He was the one who visited Jesus by night so that it was a secret and then asked questions, recognising that Jesus had come from God. He couldn't understand all what Jesus was saying but it left a deep impression on him. We cannot fully understand and must wait to know fully what Jesus meant about the Kingdom of God. But I personally can think of God as Father and, also, as Jesus who lived a human life, plus as the Holy Spirit to enable me to do the things God asks of me — if I will only ask the Spirit to fall on me.
