I am upheld by this Bible verse. 1 Peter 4:11 "If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ".

I am so pleased that I responded in this way and feel that I have grown and have been truly blessed through doing so. There may well be needs that all of us can identify. If we respond to those needs, who knows what blessings we will receive.
