Psalm 125 states 3 simple but profound truths: Those who trust in the Lord are safe and secure, those who trust in the Lord have a secure inheritance, and finally, those who trust in the Lord have a secure future.

We know the Lord surrounds us on every side like the mountains that surround Jerusalem, and you cannot get much safer than that!

So, we see what God provides for us but what about what we provide for ourselves and others? In our reading from James 2, we see how we need to behave in the Lord's name, we must not judge the poor for they are rich in faith and heirs, we should follow scripture as failure to keep one piece is failure to keep it all, I know from personal experience that I don't always behave the way I should, we all falter sometimes, people often assume God's people are good people but the Lord knows form the moment he created us that we were likely to fail, he gave Adam and Eve rules but they broke them and we continue to break rules even now.
