Reflection

Our reflection for this Sunday is brought to us by Rev Derek Grimshaw

When my eldest daughter was about seven, I decided that the time had come for me to take the stabilizers off her bike and get her off riding without them. One glorious sunny Saturday morning I ran along the road behind her, holding onto the saddle as she pedalled for all she was worth. But I didn't have the confidence to let go for fear of her falling off and hurting herself, sweating profusely with my heart pounding in my chest, I gave in after two or three runs deciding that maybe today wasn't the day. We shared a caravan with my brother and sister-in-law at the time, and they were staying in it that weekend, so went to spend the afternoon with them. My nephew, a year younger than my daughter saw that the stabilizers had been removed and wanted the ones on his bike taking off. My brother and I had one run around the field in the blazing afternoon sun and decided that was enough. What followed was quite amazing, the two youngsters got on their bike and fell off, they got back on and gave it another go and in the space of ten or fifteen minutes they were off.

Thursday 29th May was Ascension Day, one of the lesser-known Christian festivals and unlike Christmas and Easter, it will have passed most people by, yet it is an important marker on our Christian journey. Jesus has spent three years training his disciples, counselling them in the core values of what we now know as Christianity and preparing them to be the leaders of this new way of being the people of God. We talk about being "Easter People" people who walk in the light of the risen Lord, and the Gospel story doesn't finish with the death of Christ, while that is a definite ending to his chapter of ministry, there is more to come and the Christ who once was dead meets in his risen power with his



disciples, yet this was never meant to be the long term plan, this was for a season and at the ascension we see this phase come to an end and Jesus returns to his father in heaven.

In our reading from the Acts of the Apostles we are reminded that Jesus orders the disciples not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there until the helper (the Holy Spirit) came. The story goes to tell of the time when Jesus was taken back up into heaven and the disciples were now left to go out into the world and do the work that Christ had prepared them for. There is a natural process of learning the principles of whatever we are doing and then comes the time of practical application. This is perhaps the best example of succession planning that the world has ever seen, Jesus has confidence in a job well done and now in the power of the Holy Spirit the disciples set about establishing the most populous world religion that two thousand years later is constantly reshaping to serve the modern age with all its challenges.

The most wonderful thing is that we are called today, to open our hearts and minds to where the Spirit is leading us and on that sunny Saturday afternoon about thirty years ago when my daughter and nephew learned to ride their bikes, I learned that life is about giving it a go, falling off, getting up and trying again until the moment comes when we can take control and make a difference with the Holy Spirit leading us in what we do.
