Dear Friends,

This feels very strange for me. After spending most of the last year dealing with all my "lasts" in the Ipswich circuit and saying goodbye to a long list of people I have come to know well during my eleven years as their superintendent minister, I now turn the corner and start to say "hello" to a lot of new people in the Central Norfolk Circuit.



Looking back, the last five years have been some of the toughest of my ministry mainly because of all the challenges surrounding the Covid 19 pandemic. I was talking with a lady recently who worked as a supermarket manger during lockdown, and she was telling me of all the negatives of trying to keep shoppers safe and the barrage of abuse they had to deal with. After a moments reflection she said, "but we learned so much through that whole experience" and I admit to feeling the same.

I will never forget the days following the start of the first Lockdown, I got up, sat at my desk, and hadn't a clue what to do with myself, I had a full diary, but couldn't fulfil any appointments, I had services to conduct, that weren't happening, and I felt a huge responsibility for the staff of the circuit and all the Churches. It is easy to look back at those days and see only the negatives, but as I reflect, like my supermarket friend, we learned so much from that whole experience.

We possibly all find change difficult, I want to thank Jacqui and Jen for the work they have done in the Central Norfolk Circuit during that same period. I had the pleasure of working alongside Jacqui when we both worked in the Norwich Circuit in neighbouring churches, and I hope to pick up the good work she has done and move the Circuit forward for the next five years.

My original plan was to retire this summer. I had a sabbatical last year and found the whole thing a struggle, one of the biggest lessons I learned was that I am not ready to give up yet, but I feel that I still have much to offer to the Church, my next stipulation was "not another superintendency". But God knew different and here I am.

Please don't think for a moment that I resent coming and working with you, I have come to love working with small village and Market towns and best of all as we come to live and work among you, we will be just twenty minutes from our eldest daughter and our grandson.

Without a doubt, the Church in the western world is facing a period of change which goes far beyond a change of personnel, we know that there are fewer people around to deal with the day to day running of the Church and many of us are tired, but I can't believe that God has finished with His Church, and he will lead us through our time together.

I look forward to meeting with you all during the coming weeks.



OUR STORY

Derek and Karen

Karen and I come as a pair and I thought that you might like to hear a little bit about our story, we are both what is sometimes referred to as "cradle Methodists" having attended Church from being small babies.

TO CONTROL OF THE PARTY OF THE

I was born in the village of Calverley in West Yorkshire which sits midway

between the cities of Leeds and Bradford. I have one brother who is a year older than me, both my parents were extremely active in the village chapel, so it was inevitable that my brother and I would be absorbed into the "Chapel culture" and attended Sunday school and I became a Church member aged thirteen.

Karen's paternal family were evacuated from Guernsey during the second world war and settled in Bradford and like me, Karen's family were involved in the life of one of the other Churches in the same circuit. Karen has two sisters both younger than her and they all attended Church from an early age.

I left school at sixteen, chiefly because my dad was seventy-two that year and after a lifetime of working in the woollen mill as mule spinner, he was retired, and my brother and I had to go out and earn some money. All I wanted to do was to work as sales rep, chiefly so that I would be supplied with a company Ford Cortina, I was very driven, and my dream came true and in my late teens I was travelling the length and breadth of the country.

The only problem with my career choice was that I wasn't very good at it and aged twenty-two, I was promoted into a management position and spent the next twenty-five years working in what became known as logistics management, running large distribution centres.

Karen and I met at the Methodist Association of Youth Clubs MAYC London weekend in May 1980, my brother and I sat behind her and her friend on the coach, he married one girl, I married the other. My brother and sister-in-law celebrated their fortieth wedding anniversary last year and Karen and I mark our Ruby wedding in September 2025.

We hit a rocky patch in the late eighties when both my parents died, our eldest daughter Laura died when she was just sixteen hours old, and Karen's father was involved in a fatal traffic collision. But against all this sadness we were blessed with our two girls, Amy and Emma. I was working hard in my management role and Karen was working as a registered childminder, looking after a string of children who became an extension of our family.

After being a local preacher for fifteen years and having felt called to the ministry for many years, I had never followed my call, because with a young family, taking time out to attend theological college didn't feel viable. Things changed and the Methodist Church opened a pathway for training part time while working full time.

Looking back, I don't know how I ever managed it, I started my training in 2001 while working full time, spending time on placement in a neighbouring circuit, and being a husband and dad at the same time. Relocating was always a big deal, and we were stationed to Hethersett, Framingham Earl, and Brooke in the Norwich Circuit in September 2005 and I was ordained at the Blackpool conference of 2007.

What is fascinating is that my maternal grandmother grew up in the National Children's Home and for most of my life I knew nothing of her story. I have now discovered through research that her mother lived in the village of Brooke in Norfolk, the very place where my presbyteral ministry began, and my great, great, great, grandfather grew up in the village of Sporle in Norfolk during the early nineteenth century and candidated for the Primitive Methodist Ministry as an eighteen-year-old following a camp meeting in the village and served in and around East Anglia.

Even though my roots are firmly fixed in West Yorkshire I feel to be back where I belong, and Karen and I look forward to working with you. Amy and our grandson Alexander live in Hethersett and Emma and her husband Alex will be living with us in Dereham, so the family feels to be back together again.

EAST ANGLIA METHODIST HERITAGE CENTRE AT WIGHTON

Last year we opened 2 days a week from late May to late October. We had than 400 more visitors from many parts of the UK and beyond. This year we opened at Easter (late March) and will be open Tuesdays and Fridays till September 27th.



Methodist items of historic interest are regularly given to us and form part of our ongoing and changing displays. Well worth a visit or a second visit. Material for our

reference library continues to be brought to us by the box load, so much so that we have run out of space for the box files storing it.

The Circuit Meeting have given us permission to expand. NNDC have given us full planning consent to build an extension on the school room/library and to convert the two toilets



into one accessible toilet walk-in and а store. As soon as the plans have been costed we will be seeking donations and applying for grants.

ANGELA CYCLES THE CENTRAL NOFOLK CIRCUIT IN AID OF HOLT'S LIGHT AND LIFE FOR ALL FUND

Soon after 9 o'clock on Friday the 28th June Natasha and I were greeted by Tony at Holt Methodist church. We explained to Natasha the alterations that are planned to make the building more 'user friendly' and showed her the architect's drawings demonstrating how natural light will fill the church when the Rose Windows are exposed. We then set off on our laden bikes for North Elmham, on back lanes rather than the Dereham Rd, where a friend promised us coffee and cake. From there we peddled back and forth to the 6 churches and chapels in the Dereham area. Wendling chapel had kindly been left open for us so we could make use of the facilities over our picnic lunch. That day we cycled 41 miles.

After the night in Dereham we set off soon after 8 o'clock for our biggest day of the ride which was 51½ miles. Natasha realised she had a slow puncture by the time we reached Garvestone, when we arrived at Hingham a kind 'Yellow Van Man' used his air compressor to re inflate the tyre to full pressure. By then we were behind schedule and sending messages to stewards waiting for our arrival. Watton provided us with drinks and biscuits and, after mending the puncture, hand washing facilities. We pushed on with flying visits to Saham Hills and the Hive and were found collapsed in a scrap of shade at Swaffham



church by Ann and her husband. It was a hot day and despite drinking lots of water I, at least, was a bit dehydrated. We had 3 more chapels to visit before reaching our B&B in Hempton, we had planned to visit Sculthorpe too but ran out of time and energy.

The final day saw us starting in rain at 8.30 by popping out to Sculthorpe and back, luckily I knew the cycle route which meant crossing main roads but not cycling on them. Then we cycled east to Stibbard before heading north and into a cold wind, to Fulmodeston and Walsingham. Reaching the South Gate entrance to Holkham park and the way to New Holkham chapel a security man told us 'Sorry, closed for a 5 day photo shoot'. But Natasha gave him her best smile and he gave us permission to visit the chapel and return to the same gate, phew! So we reached Wells church and the promised home-made cake at about 12.15. Elizabeth and others made us welcome and gave me a generous contribution to our cause, the Holt Light and Life for All. We then had a short stop at the Wighton Heritage Centre, and a longer stop for a sandwich by the River Stiffkey. We returned to Holt church at 3.30 where we were welcomed by Jenny and Stephen. We'd cycled 40 miles that day, though Natasha had another 5½ to get her home.

We had taken photos at every church we visited, both for our personal records and to prove we had been there. The whole trip was 132 miles and raised £1059 for the Light and Life for All fund.






Holt Methodist Church Bible Study Group
